We are almost there! The AP World History exam is **May 14, 2015**, and we have about one month to review everything that we've covered over the past year. Part of this review will involve you becoming an expert in one region of the world, and teaching your classmates everything you know about that region.

This is going to involve **a lot of work**, since you are synthesizing everything you've learned and focusing your historical thinking skills into one particular region of the world. **Do not procrastinate on this.**

Your group will use Microsoft Movie Maker to make a movie/presentation to teach the rest of the class about your region throughout World History. (Period1-6). These presentations will then be posted on Edline. All students will be responsible for viewing the regional material and be tested on the information.

You will go through each major time period (you can combine Periods 1 & 2), and for each period, you will need to talk about:

Geography – What does the area look like ...

Social - Social organizations (For example- is there a caste system? What are the major labor systems used here? Are racial categories important? How are merchants viewed? How are women treated here? Etc)

Political - Major governments/empires/dynasties -Give the causes for their rise and fall

Interaction with Environment – In what ways did the societies of this regions impact the environment around them? -ex. - irrigation, dams, coal mining etc.

Culture - Major religions/philosophies/religious movements -explain the beliefs of these religions, and their social/political effects on the region. Don't just talk about the religions that originate in this region- talk about religions that are brought TO the region in the appropriate time period. So Christianity should come up in Latin America, Islam in SEA, etc). Major works of art/literature/architecture that came out of each region. Show, don't tell-include pictures whenever possible! Why is this work significant?

Economic - Major trade routes/organizations in this region. What goods were traded where? (Use map for this) How did people make their money. What crops?

CCOT Ideas - Major continuities and changes from the period before. Practice your CCOT skills. When you introduce each new Period (after Period 1/2), give us some of the major changes/continuities that can be found. Why did these changes happen?
